

Dove Class Learning Activities (2)

Hello Doves! I hope you are all well and have had a good Easter Holiday. Here are some activities to keep you working hard. Also enjoy exercising and cooking some delicious new recipes. Thankyou.

English

Please read daily and write a book review of your favourite book. Write a daily diary.

Write an alternative ending for "The Water Horse", which we read and watched as a class.

Choose a poem that you like and learn it off by heart. Perform it to your family.

Choose a person who inspires you and, using inverted commas, write an imaginary interview with them. Remember the new speaker, new line, rule.

Story writing - choose a time in history that you would like to travel back in time to visit. Write a story about what happened to you there. Do you remember our volcano story planner? Opening, build-up, climax, resolution, ending! Use this format to plan and write your own story. Remember paragraphs.

Spellings - Year 3: How many words can you find and learn to spell ending in suffixes -al and -ary.

Year 4: How many words can you find and learn to spell ending in -ar and -er and with the suffix -ous.

Maths- Do Active Learn daily please!

Measure at least 10 objects around your home and record in mm, cm and m.

Draw a graph to show these lengths to the nearest cm.

Do a shape hunt in your house - how many shapes can you find?

Practise your times tables from 2x to 12x. Ask a grown up to time you to see how quickly you can recite each times-table! There are games to practise at <http://www.snappymaths.com/>

Challenge yourself to choose a target number eg 1000. How many different ways can you make this number using the 4 mathematical signs?

Geography - We had just begun learning about map symbols. On the biggest piece of paper that you can find, draw your own map. It can be of an imaginary place or your local area. Make sure you have a key and each part of the axis is labelled.

Find out as much as you can about the different time zones in the world.

Choose any volcano in the world and research it to create a fact file.

Science - Choose your favourite animal and try to draw a picture of its skeleton. Find out what part a producer, predator and prey play in the food chain. Choose a food chain to draw and explain.

French - Write a daily diary to describe the weather in French. Draw pictures to go with it.

Art and DT - Look in your garden or the park. Draw a detailed picture of an insect, a tree and a flower you can see there. Try and look up the picture "Tiger in a Tropical Storm" by Rousseau. Can you draw your own version?

Try and make a miniature version of the volcano that you have chosen to write about in Geography.
