Can you find out about the names of the four sections of an orchestra and which instruments are in each one? Using any cardboard boxes or containers can you make your own musical instrument?

Light and Rainbows

How are rainbows formed? Find out then draw/make your own rainbow out of anything you like...Fimo, Hama Beads.

Write your own rainbow poem. Think about what each colour reminds you of and how it makes you feel. Try and include similes/metaphor or personification.

When light travels from one material to another it bends. Draw an arrow on a piece of paper. Hold arrow behind a transparent glass of water. What happens to the arrow? Write different letters of the alphabet and try them behind the glass – see what happens.

Make a shadow puppet animal from card – experiment with a torch – how can you make the animal bigger/ smaller?

Inventions: Invent a crazy machine. Draw it and label how it works. What does it do? How does it work? Use: *because, so, next, then* and *after* to help your explanation.
