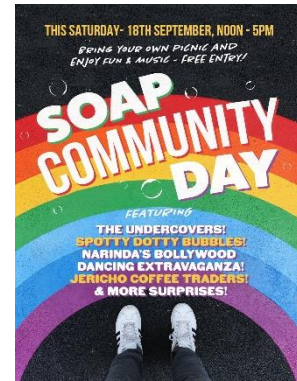




South Oxford Adventure Playground

SOAP has recently been granted a 5 year lease from Oxford City Council (OCC) for a small slither of woodland that runs adjacent to SOAP. It is shown here on the map.

There will be no impact on public access to the wood or existing paths running through from Dean's Ham to the lane and Grandpont Rec. We will work closely with OCC Park's Service to manage and minimise any environmental impact, and explore partnerships with and input from environmental groups such as Berks, Bucks and Oxon Wildlife Trust (BBOWT).
