

Class: Owls	Topic Title: Explore!			Term: Summer 2022
<p>English Read information texts about Australia and Australian animals, a range of Australian picture books and Aboriginal stories. Read information texts about African animals and a range of picture books set in Africa. Practise answering reading comprehension questions. Improve reading aloud in Guided Reading. Learn stories of <i>The Greedy Frog</i> and <i>Honey and Trouble</i> (Hear, map, step, speak, deepen, write). Write own version of these stories, reports and letters. Write sentences which describe characters and settings, including by using expanded noun phrases. Continue sentence work: extending sentences using co-ordination & subordination. Work on the accurate use of punctuation. In spelling, continue to reinforce phonics knowledge and learn common exception words and homophones. Practise speaking & listening in groups and in front of the class. Explore drama work linked to learning stories. Choose and learn a poem by heart and perform to others.</p>	<p>Maths Locate, order & compare 2-digit numbers on number lines & squares & use < > signs. Count in 100s to 1000. Add & subtract 2-digit numbers by counting on in 10s and 1s. Use doubles & number bonds to add 3 single-digit numbers. Use number facts to 10 and 20 in number stories. Find complements to multiples of 10 and begin to understand subtraction as a difference, found by counting up. Add 2-digit numbers using partitioning. Measure weight & capacity using standard or uniform non-standard units and draw a block graph where one square represents two units. Weigh items using 100g weights and scales marked in multiples of 1 kg or 100g. Begin to measure capacity in litres & multiples of 100ml. Double multiples of 10 and 5. Double 2-digit numbers ending in 1, 2, 3 or 4. Find a quarter of numbers up to 40. Find $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$ of amounts.</p>	<p>Science Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals. Notice that animals have offspring. Identify & name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats. Learn about simple food chains. Observe & describe how seeds & bulbs grow into mature plants. Find out & describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.</p>	<p>Computing Use technology safely and responsibly e.g. using passwords and not sharing personal information online. Learn to use bookmarking so can find a safe site again. Send and receive an email as a class. Use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content.</p>	<p>Music/Singing Understand that sounds can be made in different ways and begin to build a pattern of sounds to represent an animal. Begin to recognise tempo, dynamics and pitch. Explore South African music using <i>Charanga</i>. Use the <i>BBC Ten Pieces</i> website to explore a range of classical and contemporary music.</p>
